

Christian	A Christian is a follower of Jesus Christ, believing He is God's Son, the Messiah, who came to save humanity, and whose life, death (crucifixion), and resurrection offer forgiveness and eternal life.	 <p>The diagram illustrates the Christian Worldview through four key concepts: Creation, Incarnation, Salvation, and the Trinity. Denomination	A religious denomination is a distinct subgroup within a larger religion, sharing a common name, traditions, identity, and often an organizational structure.		
Data	Facts and statistics that have been collected together to offer answers or analysis.		
Belief	Belief is the mental acceptance that something is true or exists, often without complete proof, representing a conviction, faith, or opinion.		
Survey	A survey is a structured method to collect information or opinions from a sample of people, often via a questionnaire, to understand a larger group's

Census	A census is a systematic count and detailed survey of a population, most commonly referring to national population and housing censuses conducted periodically (typically every 10 years) to gather data.		
Christian worldviews	A Christian worldview is a thorough view, rooted in the Bible, that interprets all of life through the belief in a Creator God, the significance of Jesus Christ's redemption, and God's ultimate purpose for humanity and the world.
