## **Mathematics**

## Year 5:

- **Statistics** (line graphs and tables)
- Shape (degrees, angles, polygons)
- Position and direction (Coordinates, reflection, symmetry, translation)
- Decimals (subtract, add, multiply, divide, sequences)

### Year 6:

- Area and volume (triangles, parallelograms, cuboids)
- Statistics (graphs, piecharts)
- Shape (angles)
- Position and direction (Coordinates, reflection, translation)

## **English**

We will begin this term with a study of the classic epic poem – the legend of Beowulf (one of the most important works of Old English literature). This should link to our Anglo-Saxon topic.

We will then use our narrative skills in some independent writing towards the end of the term.

We will also be preparing some creative writing around our class book, 'When the Sky Falls', in preparation for submitting work to this year's Reading Teachers' Author event in Cheltenham.

Spelling and grammar lessons will continue, in which we will explore the technical aspects of writing.

Our Booktalk reading sessions will continue with a broad range of fiction, non-fiction and poetry texts which the children will discuss and analyse using

## Painting and mixed media (Light and dark)

- To investigate different ways of applying paint.
- To mix tints and shades of a colour.
- To use tints and shades to give a three-dimensional effect when painting.
- Exploring different painting techniques and recreating them when painting a simple 3D object
- 5 still life artists over time: Carravagio, Monet, Cezanne, Dali, Warhol
- To consider proportion and composition when planning a still-life painting.
- To apply knowledge of colour mixing and painting techniques to create a finished piece

## **Music: Film Music**

- Identify how different styles of music contribute to the feel of a film.
- To appraise different musical features in a variety of film contexts.
- To identify and understand some composing techniques in film music.
- To use graphic scores to interpret different emotions in film music.
- To create and notate musical ideas and relate them to film music.
- To play a sequence of musical ideas to convey emotion.
