



# Light and Dark Knowledge Mat

<b>light source</b>	Something that gives out light		<input type="checkbox"/> Light sources can be man made ( torches, lamps, candles, ) some are natural ( sun, glow worms)
<b>opaque</b>	A material that does not let light through		<input type="checkbox"/> Candles are made from wax and a wick. The wax melts when hot and turns from a solid to a liquid
<b>reflect</b>	When light hits an object and bounces off		
<b>translucent</b>	A material that lets some light through but you can not see through it clearly	<b>Important image to understand by the end of the Celebrations unit:</b>  	<input type="checkbox"/> Lights sources vary in strength and can be measured by a light meter.
<b>transparent</b>	A material that lets light through and you can see through it clearly		<input type="checkbox"/> Materials can be opaque, translucent or transparent
<b>shadow</b>	The dark shape an opaque object makes when it is between the light source and the surface		<input type="checkbox"/> Opaque materials form shadows when lit from behind
<b>adaption</b>	How animals and plants change to ensure that they can live in their habitat		<input type="checkbox"/> Nocturnal animals have a range of adoptions to help them navigate their world in the dark
<b>nocturnal</b>	Animals which are active at night and sleep during the day		<input type="checkbox"/> Nocturnal animals are active in the night and asleep in the day
			<input type="checkbox"/> Nocturnal animals include hedgehogs, badgers, bats and owls
