## Religious Education

### Christianity: What do Christians believe Jesus did to save human beings?

#### Key vocabulary

<b>Easter</b>	The Christian festival that celebrates Jesus' <b>resurrection</b> .
<b>Stations of the Cross</b>	Images of the significant events in the death of Jesus.
<b>Crucifixion</b>	A way of being killed by being nailed onto a cross.
<b>Symbolism</b>	The use of symbols and actions to represent religious concepts
<b>Resurrection</b>	The act of dead things coming back to life.
<b>Sacrifice</b>	Giving something important up to help others.
<b>Salvation</b>	Rescue (if you are given salvation, you are saved).
<b>Last Supper</b>	The meal Jesus ate with his disciples prior to his arrest and execution
<b>Gospels</b>	The four books in the bible that tell stories of Jesus. Gospel means 'good news'.
<b>Holy Communion</b>	This is when Christians drink wine and eat bread as part of a church service. This is also called <b>Eucharist</b>

#### Key Objectives for this unit

- Explore the end of Jesus' life through artwork.
- Explore who was responsible for Jesus' death.
- Consider the idea of sacrifice.
- Explore the symbolism of communion and its links to the last supper.
- Consider why communion is important to Christians.

#### Key Knowledge

- Christians believe that Jesus died to save people from their sins.
- The Gospels tell the stories of Jesus' life and death
- At Communion, Christians take bread and wine, as Jesus did at the last supper. This reminds them of the body and blood of Jesus.
