


**What do Muslims believe about God, and how do they respond?**

Key Vocabulary				Sticky Knowledge
<b>Islam</b>	The religion of the Muslims, a monotheistic faith regarded as revealed through Muhammad as the Prophet of Allah.			<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Learning and memorizing the 99 Names of Allah is believed to strengthen faith and understanding of Allah.</li> </ul>
<b>Muslim</b>	People who follow the religion of Islam, and believe in Allah, as the only God.			<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The Qur'an is the Islamic Holy Book, believed to be Allah's own divine speech.</li> </ul>
<b>Muhammad</b>	The last prophet chosen by Allah, who was chosen to receive revelations from Allah and taught Muslims how to live, through the text of the Qur'an.		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Muslims believe that they must follow the Five Pillars of Islam, which tells them how to live their lives.</li> </ul>	
<b>Tawhid</b>	The belief in the absolute oneness, uniqueness and indivisibility of Allah.		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Tawhid shows that Allah is one, without partner, peer or equal in His Essence, Attributes and Lordship.</li> </ul>	
<b>Qur'an</b>	The Holy Book of Islam, contains the revelations Allah passed down to Muhammad.			<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Dhikr is a central form of Islamic worship, where Muslims repeatedly say Allah's names. This keeps awareness of Allah.</li> </ul>
<b>99 Names of God</b>	Are the attributes of Allah in Islam, taken from the Qur'an.			<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A Surah is a chapter or verse in the Qur'an. There are 114 Surahs in total.</li> </ul>
<b>Shahadah</b>	Is the first of the five pillars of Islam and is the declaration of faith.			<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Muslims pray to Allah five times a day. Always facing Mecca</li> </ul>

<p><b>Allah</b></p>	<p>Allah is the Arabic word for God, referring to the one and only God in Islam. It is the central concept of the Muslim faith, embodying the belief in the oneness and absolute unity of God, who is the creator and sustainer of the universe.</p>
