Sticky Knowledge

- The Ten Commandments are a set of ten laws which Jews believe God told Moses; they believe that if these laws are not followed in a way which pleases him they will be punished. The Ten Commandments play a large part in how Jews choose to live their everyday life.
- Rosh Hashanah is a celebration of the creation of the world and marks making a fresh start.
- Pesach is a Jewish holiday that lasts for 8 days and nights. It celebrates how Jews left slavery behind them.
- Yom Kippur means day of Atonement. It is a day to reflect on the past year and ask God's forgiveness for any sins.
