### What influence does believing in God as Trinity have on Christian worldviews?

<b>New Testament</b>	The part of the Bible that tells Christians about Jesus		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Most Christians are monotheists (they believe in one God) who believe in the Trinity.</li> </ul>
<b>Trinity</b>	The idea that God exists in three parts – Father, Son and Holy Spirit		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The Trinity is made up of God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit.</li> </ul>
<b>Apostle</b>	Jesus' 12 disciples are also known as apostles. Apostles are also those who started the Christian Church.		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>For many Christians, evidence of the Trinity can be found in the Bible and a summary of it in the Apostles' Creed</li> </ul>
<b>Creed</b>	A statement of belief.		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The Apostles' Creed is a statement of Christian beliefs. It is not used by all Christian Churches</li> </ul>
<b>Baptism</b>	A Christian ceremony (or sacrament) where someone joins the church, usually involving the pouring of, or immersion in, water.		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Many Christians have different ideas on the relationship between Father, Son and Holy Spirit and how these influence their lives.</li> </ul>
<b>Analogy</b>	A way of explaining something by comparing it to something else		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>There are differences in how Christians focus on the Holy Spirit in worship.</li> </ul>
<b>Pentecost</b>	A Christian festival that remembers the coming of the Holy Spirit to the Apostles		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Many Christians find it hard to explain what the Holy Spirit is.</li> </ul>
<b>Sacrament</b>	A significant Christian ceremony such as baptism, confirmation or the Eucharist		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>There is evidence in the bible that although the Holy Spirit was sent to help the Apostles after Jesus' death, it existed before this.</li> </ul>
