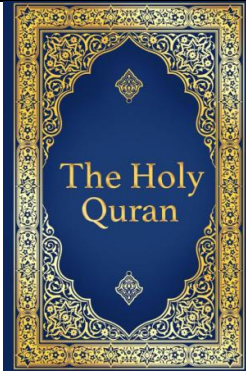
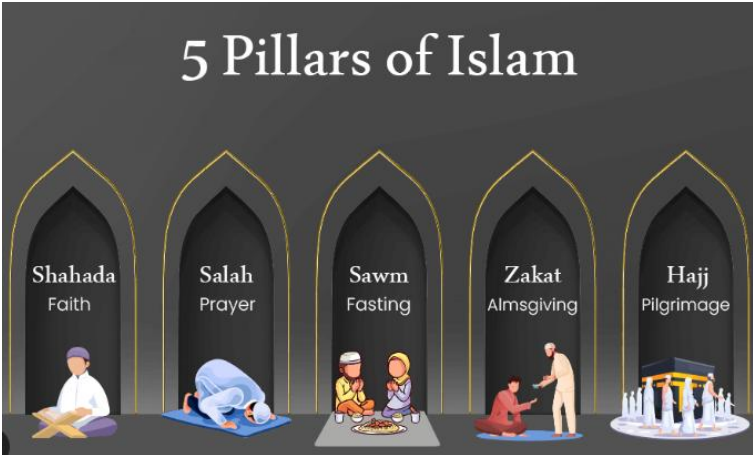

Why is Muhammad important to Muslims today?

Key Vocabulary		  	Sticky Knowledge
Islam	The religion of the Muslims, a monotheistic faith regarded as revealed through Muhammad as the Prophet of Allah.		Muslims are monotheists (they believe in one God).
Muslim	People who follow the religion of Islam, and believe in Allah, as the only God.		The Qur'an is the Islamic Holy Book, believed to be Allah's own divine speech.
Muhammad	The last prophet chosen by Allah, who was chosen to receive revelations from Allah and taught Muslims how to live, through the text of the Qur'an.		Muslims believe that they must follow the Five Pillars of Islam, which tells them how to live their lives.
Prophet	Someone who was chosen by Allah to be their messenger.		When speaking the Prophets' name, Muslims always say – Peace Be Upon Him (pbuh) afterwards.
Qur'an	The Holy Book of Islam, contains the revelations Allah passed down to Muhammad.		Muhammad (pbuh) lived over 1400 years ago.
Seal of the Prophets	Muslims believe Muhammad was the final prophet sent by Allah, and no prophets will come after him		Muhammad (pbuh) received revelations over 23 years.
Revelation	A divine or supernatural message to humans that relates to human existence or religion.		Muslims pray to Allah five times a day. Always facing Mecca

Allah	Allah is the Arabic word for God, referring to the one and only God in Islam. It is the central concept of the Muslim faith, embodying the belief in the oneness and absolute unity of God, who is the creator and sustainer of the universe.
