- Hindus believe in one God, the Ultimate Reality, known as Brahman.
- Most Hindu homes have a shrine where offerings are made, and prayers are said; family members may choose to worship together in the home.
- In the UK, Hindus are more likely to regularly visit the temple as it gives them an opportunity to meet with other Hindu communities in the area.
