Key vocabulary

Belonging	The feeling of being loved, accepted, and understood as part of a group, family, school, or community			
Raksha Bandham	A Hindu festival where sisters tie a rakhi (a sacred thread or bracelet) on their brothers' wrists to show love and ask for protection, with brothers promising to look after their sisters and often giving a gift			
Infant Baptism	Infant baptism is a Christian ceremony, also called a christening, where a baby is welcomed into the Christian faith and the church community using symbols like water, a cross, and a candle.			
Naming Ceremony A personalized, non-religious celebration for welcoming a child their family and community,				

Key Information that you should know by the end of the unit
